Student catering Student and Staff counselling service	The University of the Aegean provides for subsidized catering in every University Unit. Students on the islands of Lesvos, Samos, Chios, and Rhodes may have lunch and dinner at University-owned restaurants, whereas students on the island of Syros are entitled to eat at restaurants that have contracts with the University. The University of the Aegean offers counselling services to students and staff on each UAegean island. Counselling is offered free of charge. It is supported by trained professionals with full respect for medical confidentiality
Health Insurance	All incoming Erasmus students should be medically insured during their stay at the UAegean. Erasmus students from EU countries will forward a copy of their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) to the Erasmus+ Office before their arrival. EHIC is a free health card that is issued by national health insurance providers and gives access to medically necessary, state-provided healthcare during a temporary stay in any of the 28 EU countries, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway and Switzerland, under the same conditions and at the same cost (free in some countries) as people insured in that country. 	Before their arrival to the UAegean, students and staff coming from non- EU countries are requested to submit copies of the required private insurance contracts to the Erasmus+ Office

All exchange students and staff members should be aware that the visa application process lasts approximately one month and that an acceptance letter from the University of the Aegean may be required.
